SBA DISASTER LOAN DEADLINE IS August 5; *SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS STILL HAVE TIME TO APPLY*

ATLANTA - The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding businesses that **August 5** is the filing deadline for federal economic injury disaster loans that are available to small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives and most private, non-profit organizations of all sizes located in the counties of Rockingham and Stokes in the State of North Carolina. The SBA declared a disaster because of damages and losses to crops caused by drought and excessive heat that began on January 1, 2008.

“These counties are eligible because they are contiguous to one or more primary counties in the Commonwealth of Virginia. SBA recognizes that disasters do not usually stop at the county or state lines. For that reason, counties adjacent to primary counties named in the declaration are included,” according to Frank Skaggs, Director of SBA’s Field Operations Center East.

Under this declaration, SBA’s Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL) program is available to farm-related and nonfarm-related small business concerns and small agricultural cooperatives that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible to apply to SBA, but nurseries are eligible to apply for economic injury disaster loans for losses caused by drought conditions.

Eligible small businesses may qualify for loans up to \$2 million. These loans are available at a 4 percent interest rate with loan terms up to 30 years. SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by SBA and are based upon each applicant’s financial condition. Under this disaster declaration, SBA cannot provide loans to agricultural producers.

Completed loan applications must be returned to SBA no later than August 5, 2009.
